RULES

The Old Home Week English Horse Show competition is sanctioned as a Bronze and Gold competition member of:

EQUESTRIAN CANADA

c/o House of Sport 2451 Riverside Drive, Ottawa, Ontario, K1H 7X7 and is governed by the rules of EC

Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book. (A602.2)

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane (A602.3(f)).

Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control (drug testing) while at the event location. (A602.5)

Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, coach, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC, and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC-sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition." (A602.7)

PLEASE NOTE: All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations.

ARTICLE A519 VACCINATIONS

All horses attending EC sanctioned competitions must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1 and 4) vaccinations within six (6) months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the competition. No horse shall have received vaccination within seven (7) days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be asked to leave the event site at the discretion of competition management.

The frequency of vaccine administration should be as recommended by the vaccine manufacturer or veterinarian. It is recommended that vaccines be administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian. Competition management may request supporting documentation confirming a horse's compliance with mandatory vaccination requirements. (A519) Vaccinations

In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccines, a letter must be provided with the entry form from a veterinarian, on official letterhead, stating the equine cannot be

vaccinated due to medical concerns. At the discretion of competition management, a log of the horse's temperature prior to arrival at the event site or during the event can be requested.

EQUESTRIAN CANADA STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction. EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of the horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities.
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.
- Ensuring that all Equestrians including owners, coaches, and competitors, or their respective agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment, and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.
- Providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives.
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.
- Requiring owners, coaches, and competitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions, and;
- Actively promoting the development and adherence of competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

Applicable EC Rule Book references are sometimes noted but are not a substitute for knowledge of the Rule Book itself.

1. Memberships:
 - a. All Canadian owners and riders must have a valid EC Gold or Bronze Sport Licence (A205) - (A207) OR purchase a Single Event Upgrade (A211) or Licence Transfer (A212) for a Silver or Bronze Sport Licence to Gold Licence.
 - b. Competitors also require provincial territorial sport organization (PTSO) membership.
 - c. All athletes and owners must be holders of a current membership in their home country's national federation.
 - d. All athletes competing in Amateur classes must possess a valid EC Amateur Card and must present it to the Competition Secretary upon request (A902)
 - e. Exception: Lead line riders require only a PEIHC or other PTSO membership
 - f. Please be aware that PEIHC membership is required to participate in and/or benefit from the PEIHC Programs/Classes. PEIHC is required to collect points towards PEIHC year-end awards.
2. EC Horse Recordings/FEI Passports
 - a. All Canadian entries are required to have an EC Horse Recording with a valid EC horse licence to compete (A402) in Gold classes, or, if owned by a temporary

sport licence holder, a Temporary Horse Registration form must be purchased at each competition entered.

- b. Exception: Lead line riders
 - c. Horse licences are not required for horses competing in Bronze classes, however if a competitor wishes to compete in Gold classes they must purchase a temporary horse licence or purchase a horse licences.
3. Equine Medication Control and Fees
- a. Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location. A602.5
 - b. All EC-sanctioned competitions are required to collect a prescribed medication control fee for each horse entered. All fees collected are to be remitted using the Equestrian Canada Form to the Equestrian Canada Equine Medications Control Committee or its designate as per the Competition Administration Policy. This fee is to be identified on the entry form as a stand-alone item and not bundled or combined with other fees. (A1008).
 - c. Bronze competitors pay \$4.00 and Gold competitors pay \$8.00;
 - d. See A1011 for full description. The person responsible is the individual responsible and accountable for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse. The person responsible may be the coaches or may be an owner, rider, driver, agent, or coach. The person responsible must be an adult and must have an EC individual or group licence, with the exception of a Junior Exhibitor parent or guardian.
4. Entries
- a. Entries must be received online by the closing date. Any entry not received by the closing date will be considered a Late Entry and subject to an additional \$40 Late Entry administration fee.
 - b. One horse per entry form.
 - c. Entries will only be accepted online.
 - d. All entries must be complete with proper signatures, complete address, membership, and passport numbers.
 - e. The Show Committee has the right to refuse or limit entries as circumstances warrant.
 - f. No "hors concours" at this competition: Article A808.
 - g. Substitution of entries: Will be at the discretion of the OC.
 - h. Payments: Stabling, administration and levy fees must be paid up front. Entries without payment will not be accepted.
 - i. Entries are to be sent to oldhomeweekes@gmail.com Note: We will only be accepting email entries.
5. Cancellations
- a. If cancellations are received in writing prior to noon on August 14 with a copy of veterinarian certificate or medical doctor's certificate, all fees will be fully refunded less the Administration fee.
 - b. After this time there will be no refunds.
 - c. If the competition is cancelled due to Public Health Guidelines entries will be refunded or applied to a rescheduled competition.
6. Adds/Scratches
- a. At the discretion of the competition office.

- b. Acceptance of requests to add classes after the entry closing date will be at the discretion of the competition office and will depend on the number of entries per class and per day.
 - c. There will be no adding classes on the days of the show, the last day to add classes will be Sunday, August 11, 2024.
 - d. Post entries may be required to go first in class, if applicable.
 - e. All adds and scratches will be done through email.
 - f. Any entry that does not compete in a class in which it was entered and is not scratched according to the above procedures is fully liable for all fees. (See A816). A \$10 change fee applies.
7. Payment
 - a. All stabling fees, entry fees, medication fees, Jump Canada Levy, PEIHC and administration fees must be paid in full prior to the competition.
 - b. Entries will not be accepted without payment. Stalls will not be held.
 - c. Payment can only be made by email money transfer.
 - d. If stalls are purchased and paid for, the remaining fees need to be paid by June 30, 2024.
8. Unsettled Accounts
 - a. Unsettled accounts will be referred to EC, which will result in suspension from all EC competitions.
 - b. Accounts left unpaid will not be permitted to compete at future Old Home Week English Horse Shows until paid in full.
9. Schedule
 - a. If a class is not filled and is cancelled, the secretary shall notify the competitors at the earliest possible moment. No class will be cancelled if it has five or more entries; a competition may at its discretion hold a class with fewer than five entries. A505.1
 - b. An announced sequence or time for classes shall not be changed unless written notice of such change is given to all competitors and officials affected at least one hour prior to the affected class or, in the case of the first class of the day, the night before. A505.2
10. Protective Headgear
 - a. See A905 and G102. At all times, persons mounted at an EC-sanctioned event location must wear approved protective headgear.
 - b. Protective headgear must be certified under one of the following standards: ASTM (American Society for Testing Materials), or SEI (Safety Equipment Institute, Inc.); BSI/BS EN (British Standards Institution); EN (European Union Standards); or AS/NZS (Australian/New Zealand Standards).
 - c. Protective headgear must be properly fitted and securely fastened by a safety harness permanently affixed to the helmet.
11. Competition Numbers - Schooling Rules
 - a. Numbers must be worn and visible at all times in the schooling, lunging and warm-up areas, hand walking/grazing and in the competition ring (A814). Any horse wearing the incorrect number may be eliminated.
 - b. FEI Schooling rules will apply.
12. Dress Code
 - a. See G109
13. Office Hours

- a. The show office will open 45 minutes before the start of the competition day and will close 30 minutes after the last class of the day.
14. Prizes: Hunter Divisions
- a. Ribbons to 6th place.
 - b. Other prizes to be awarded at the discretion of the Show Committee.
 - c. See chart for prize money by class.
15. Payouts
- a. Every effort will be made to pay out prize money at the end of show.
 - b. Prize money may be credited to accounts.
 - c. Any remaining prize money will be mailed to competitors or owners after the competition and after verification that all entry and applicable fees have been paid (A701).
16. Presentations:
- a. Hunter competitors must return to the ring for presentation dressed appropriately and with horses in a bridle.
 - b. Jumper competitors must be neat and tidy. Riders should be mounted.
17. Stabling
- a. Stabling is limited and must be reserved on Stall Request Form.
 - b. Price is \$35 per night for a box stall.
 - c. Pre-order stalls will be available up to June 15, 2024, at a rate of \$30 per night for a box stall. These can be pre-purchased without paying other fees.
 - d. After June 15, 2024, box stalls are \$35 per night.
 - e. Bedding will not be for-sale at the competition. Please bring your own bedding.
 - f. If a stall is required before or after the scheduled time, you may be charged for another night.
 - g. Special requests to stable near others will be accommodated when possible, but not guaranteed.
 - h. All horses must be off premises by 11:00 AM Saturday, August 17, 2024.
 - i. Stalls must be cleaned out by 11:00 AM, Saturday, August 17, 2024, prior to departure.
 - j. Any costs to fix and repair damages to the stalls or property will be the responsibility of the horse owner.
18. Pony Measurement
- a. The measurement of ponies will occur Wednesday evening, the time and place will be posted on the Facebook page.
 - b. Horses may be measured randomly.
 - c. Any ponies under 8 years of age must have a temporary measurement card.
 - d. ARTICLE A1104 TEMPORARY MEASUREMENT FORMS: Until a horse or pony is eight years of age, a temporary measurement form must be obtained annually.
 - e. All ponies aged 8 and younger must be measured or have a temporary measurement form for the current year.
 - f. All ponies without a permanent or current temporary EC measurement card or without a current USEF measurement card will be measured.
 - g. Large ponies exceed 13.2 hands but do not exceed 14.2 hands.
 - h. Medium ponies exceed 12.2 hands but do not exceed 13.2 hands.
 - i. Small ponies do not exceed 12.2 hands.
19. Schooling
- a. Schooling times will be preceding each jumping class in the indoor arena, only those in the jumping class may school.

- b. An outdoor warm up ring will be provided but may be closed depending on any inclement weather. The decision to close the arena will be made at the discretion of the EC Steward and show committee.
 - c. The outdoor warm up ring will be limited to 6 riders at a time. Each rider will be given 20 minutes to ride in the outdoor, if a rider decides that they need more time, they can request an additional time slot.
 - d. The outdoor warm up ring will not have any jumps set up.
20. Arena Rental
- a. Indoor arena rental is available by 20-minute increments Wednesday (with 3 jumps, max 6 riders per 20-minute increment)
 - b. Must be pre-booked. Please contact oldhomeweekes@gmail.com. E-mails only, no phone calls please.
 - c. Rental time will be based on number of horses. Rental times and amount of time allotted will be based on overall demand, number of horses in each rental group and availability.
21. General Information
- a. Trucks and trailers must be parked in designated parking areas. Trailers are allowed in the stabling areas only to load or off-load.
 - b. Fire lanes must remain clear. Vehicles may be towed at owner's expense.
 - c. A disaster plan is in place, as per EC requirements.
22. Photography
- a. The Organizing Committee and sponsors reserve the right to use competitor photographs in promotional material and on social media unless the competitor/owners/parents/guardians makes a written request to the OC.
23. Coach Licencing:
- a. When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.
24. Accidents & Return to Sport:
- a. See article A101 of the rule book.
25. Dogs:
- a. No dogs are allowed on the Old Home Week English Horse Show grounds, including the arenas and the barn. Service Dogs are welcome.
26. Pony Riding
- a. Ponies that are ridden by an adult in the competition may not be ridden by a junior at the same competition. Adults may show large ponies in miscellaneous non-point classes hunter/jumper not limited to juniors and adult amateurs may ride large ponies in adult amateur classes where fences do not exceed 3' (0.90m)
27. Code of Conduct
- a. Each participant, guardian and/or coach must read the attached EC Code of Conduct and sign the line pertaining to the Code of Conduct on the entry form.
28. Team Championship

- a. Riders must indicate their team under the Team Championship Section of the entry form.
- b. There must be 4 riders to a team, if you do not have 4 riders, the organizing committee retains the right to combine teams.
- c. This event is not EC-sanctioned but follows the EC Code of Conduct and point system.

29. Arrival/Departure

- a. The location of parking, drop off, and directions will be indicated on the Facebook page.

TEAM CHAMPIONSHIP - Not rated for EC awards.

Each rider entered in Old Home Week English Horse Show will be able to sign up for a team (each team must have 4 riders). All applicable classes will be worth the same number of points, points for each placing will be given as per EC protocol.

This is a non-mandatory but fun chance to work together with your friends to accumulate points. There will be a Champion Team and a Reserve Champion Team. The Team with the most points, The Champion Team, will be awarded \$650 in prize money, the Reserve Champion Team, with the second highest number of points, will be awarded \$350 in Prize Money. All classes can be used to collect points, EXCEPT: Lead line, Gambler's Choice, Gerry Weldon Memorial, and the Lieutenant Governor's Cup. In the event of an equality of points, the team with the highest number of first (1st) place ribbons will win, if it is still a tie, one individual from each of the tied teams will compete in an arm wrestle.

NON-DIVISION CLASSES - Not rated for EC awards.

Maylea Manning Memorial Lead Line Class - Not rated for EC awards

Class 100 Rider and leader must have IHC or other PTSO Membership. Open to riders under the age of 10 years and must be led by a person who is over the age of 18 years. All leaders must be appropriately attired and have suitable footwear – no sandals or shorts.

Gerry Weldon Memorial Maritime Bred - Not rated for EC awards

Class 101 Open to horses and ponies whose shire and dam at the time of conception stood either in N.S., P.E.I., N.B., NFLD. English tack only. Must include a copy of Maritime Bred Certificate or letter from the breeder with entry. Please include name of sire and dam (breed of horse if known) on entry form. Horses are to walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Upon completion of the under-saddle portion of the class, the horse is stripped of tack and judged for conformation in hand and best type. Judged on Performance 40% and Conformation 60%.

The Lieutenant Governor's Cup - Not rated for EC awards

Class 102 Entries must be registered with the Canadian Sport Horse Association OR other Warm Blood horse/pony associations – CWHBA, KWPN, AHS, ATA, Etc. Certification of registration MUST be presented with entry. Please send a photocopy to show secretary for review. Entry will not be accepted without this certificate. IN HAND CLASS ONLY – horses and ponies to be judged for conformation and best of type. Judged on conformation 100%.

HUNTER DIVISIONS

SHORT STIRRUP DIVISION - Not rated for EC awards

Class 103 Short Stirrup O/F 1 Class 104 Short Stirrup O/F 2 Class 105 Short Stirrup U/S

To be judged over a course of 6 – 8 fences not to exceed 2'. Distances will not be adjusted from horses to ponies. Open to riders until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 14. Open to ponies and horses. Rider can only cross enter in X's & O's Hunter Division and Modified 2'3 Hunter.

X's & O's HUNTER DIVISION - Not rated for EC awards

Class 139 – O/F 1 Class 140 – O/F 2 Class 141 - U/S

To be judged over a course of 6 – 8 fences not to exceed 18". Distances will not be adjusted from horses to ponies. Open to riders of all ages. Open to ponies and horses.

MODIFIED 2'3 HUNTER DIVISION - Not rated for EC awards

Class 106 – Modified 2'3 O/F 1 Class 107 – Modified 2'3 O/F 2 Class 108 - Modified 2'3 U/S

To be judged over a course of 6 – 8 fences not to exceed 2'3". Distances will not be adjusted from horses to ponies. Open to riders of all ages. Open to ponies and horses.

MODIFIED 2'6 HUNTER DIVISION - Not rated for EC awards

Class 109 – Modified 2'6 O/F 1 Class 110 – Modified 2'6 O/F 2 Class 111 - Modified 2'6 U/S

To be judged over a course of 6 – 8 fences not to exceed 2'6". Distances will not be adjusted from horses to ponies. Open to riders of all ages. Open to ponies and horses.

MODIFIED 2'9 HUNTER DIVISION - Not rated for EC awards

Class 112 – Modified 2'9 O/F 1 Class 113 – Modified 2'9 O/F 2 Class 114 - Modified 2'9 U/S

To be judged over a course of 6 – 8 fences not to exceed 2'9". Distances will not be adjusted from horses to ponies. Open to riders of all ages. Open to ponies and horses.

HORSE HUNTER DERBY - Not rated for EC awards

Class 115

Open to horses that have completed at least one o/f class at this competition at 2'6" or higher. The class combines a Hunter Classic with a Handy Hunter class in a one round format. Course consists of at least 8 fences. Each horse/rider combination will receive a numerical score based on 3 elements (out of a possible 120 pts) 1) Overall hunter form – score out of possible 100 pts. 2) Rideability and Handiness – scout out of possible 10 pts. 3) High Performance – score out of possible 10 pts. Obstacles can include post & rail fences, stone walls, white board fences or gates, fences with both brush & timber, hedges, brush, logs or natural foliage. Course walk. Heights not to exceed 2'9

PONY HUNTER DERBY - Not rated for EC awards

Class 116

Open to ponies that have completed at least one o/f class at this competition at 2'3" or higher. The class combines a Hunter Classic with a Handy Hunter class in a one round format. Course

consists of at least 8 fences. Each horse/rider combination will receive a numerical score based on 3 elements (out of a possible 120 pts) 1) Overall hunter form – score out of possible 100 pts. 2) Rideability and Handiness – score out of possible 10 pts. 3) High Performance – score out of possible 10 pts. Obstacles can include post & rail fences, stone walls, white board fences or gates, fences with both brush & timber, hedges, brush, logs or natural foliage. Course walk. Heights not to exceed 2'6.

EC RATED HUNTER DIVISIONS

Conformation not considered. Hunter under saddle classes to be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. Horses may be required to gallop one way of the ring. Light contact with the bridle.

GAMBLER'S CHOICE (FEI ARTICLE 270 TOP SCORE COMPETITION) – not rated for EC awards.

Class 137 – 2'6 Gambler's Choice Class 138 – 3' Gambler's Choice

Open to all horses and riders. A maximum of 9 jumps are set up in the arena and each obstacle carries from 10 to 120 points according to its difficulty. All obstacles can be jumped in both directions. No points are awarded for an obstacle knocked down. Distances will not be adjusted from horses to ponies.

A fixed time is allocated in this Competition. During this time, the Athlete may jump any of the obstacles he wishes in any order. The Athlete who has obtained the highest number of points will be declared the winner. In the event of equality of points, the fastest time taken between the start of the fixed time and the crossing of the finishing line after the bell has been rung will decide. In the event of equality of points and time for first place, there will be a jump-off according to the same formula with a fixed time of 40 seconds, provided that this is mentioned in the Schedule (see JRs Art. 245.6). If not mentioned, the Athletes with equal points and time will share the prize.

Joker: An obstacle may be provided in the course duly marked by flags and called "Joker". The Joker may be jumped twice; 200 points are awarded each time this obstacle is jumped correctly, but if it is knocked down, 200 points must be deducted from the total points obtained so far by the Athlete.
